## Get to Know your Girl Scout Cookies!

These pictures show each Girl Scout Cookie, its package, and its key ingredients (the items that are unique to each cookie's flavor)

Print these pictures on cardstock or print and mount onto cardboard (can be index cards or from a cereal box).

Here are just some ways you can have fun while getting to know your cookies.

What other ways can you use these cards?

I'm thinking of... Take turns describing one of the cookies-you can use these cards as inspiration! See if your partner can guess what cookie you're thinking of.

Crossing Cookie River Pretend that you need to cross the river and the only way to get across is by using the "cookie stepping stones", which are spread from one shore to the other. The caller randomly calls out a cookie name, \& you can move to a card that represents that cookie. You may need to go sideways or back, but eventually you'll get to the other shore.

Memory Game Use two of the three pictures for each cookie to play a simple memory game, finding two pictures that are for the same cookie. Too easy? Try finding three matching pictures!

What am I? Ask one person to tape a picture to every player's back. Ask each other "Yes" or "no" questions, like "am I made of chocolate?", to find out what type of cookie you are.

Cookie Booth Use package cards and take turns being the customer and the Girl Scout. What questions might a customer ask? How can you help them?
